



What is a Hospitality Volunteer?

A Hospitality Volunteer is an adult who attends a YouthWorks trip with the purpose of serving behind the scenes. They help with practical tasks such as food prep, dishes and cleaning the building. There are also opportunities for Hospitality Volunteers to offer encouragement and build relationships with students throughout the trip.

Because Hospitality Volunteers serve at the housing site for all or part of the service day, **they do not count in the Adult Leader ratio** and will not be assigned to service crews. Hospitality Volunteers can visit service sites during the service day as long as they have access to a vehicle during the trip.

DAILY RESPONSIBILITIES OF HOSPITALITY VOLUNTEERS

- Assist in the kitchen with meal preps and cleanups. Tasks could include:
 - Preparing the kitchen in advance for meal prep.
 - Preparing the kitchen for cleanup.
 - Helping to prepare and/or clean up a meal.
 - Finishing dishes and cleaning up after a meal.
- Assist with various cleaning and organizing tasks around the housing site.
- Offer encouragement and moral support to participants on the trip.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR HOSPITALITY VOLUNTEERS

- Attend Community Activities.
- Attend large group worship.
- Attend Church Group Time.
- Visit service sites during the service day (as long as they have access to a vehicle during the trip).
